## ESSENTIAL TRUTH #1 - "We believe in O\_\_\_\_ God, C\_\_\_\_\_ of all things..."

Genesis 1:1 says that God created the H\_\_\_\_\_ and the E\_\_\_\_\_. In other words, he made E\_\_\_\_\_.

Deuteronomy 6:4-5 is called the S\_\_\_\_\_, the Hebrew word for "hear" which also means L\_\_\_\_\_ or O\_\_\_\_\_.

### What were God's people to hear?

"God is O\_\_\_\_\_" and "love the LORD, your God with all your H \_\_\_\_\_, S \_\_\_\_\_, and S \_\_\_\_\_.

### Who is present at creation?

- GOD (Genesis 1:1)
- The H\_\_\_\_\_ S\_\_\_\_\_ (Genesis 1:2)
- J\_\_\_\_\_ (John 1:1, 14; Colossians 1:15-17, Hebrews 1:1-2)

### Jesus' equality with God is seen in:

- OT P\_\_\_\_\_ (Isaiah 40:1-11, Isaiah 9:6-7, Isaiah 7:14)
- The V\_\_\_\_\_ B\_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 1:18-25)
- Jesus own W\_\_\_\_\_ (examples include: John 10:30, John 8:58, John 14:9-11)
- Jesus' miraculous S\_\_\_\_\_ (throughout Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John where the miracles are called signs)
- Jesus ability to know the F\_\_\_\_\_ (predicting his own betrayal, Peter's denial and the rooster crowing, the way he would die, his own resurrection, destruction of the temple, other future events, etc.)
- Jesus F\_\_\_\_\_ sins (Matthew 9:1-8)
- Jesus' R\_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, John 20-21)
- Other NT Scriptures (John 1, Colossians 1, Hebrews 1, Revelations 1)
- Jesus' A\_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, Acts 1)
- Jesus being called Lord and being W\_\_\_\_\_ by monotheistic Jews (John 20:27-28)

### In the Bible, God has revealed himself as One God in Three Persons:

God the F\_\_\_\_\_, God the S \_\_\_\_\_, and God the H\_\_\_\_\_ S \_\_\_\_\_.

This concept is known as the T\_\_\_\_\_.

### Other examples of the Trinity found in the Bible:

- Jesus' B\_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 3:16-17; Mark 1:10-11; Luke 3:22)
- The command given to the disciples in the G\_\_\_\_\_ C\_\_\_\_\_ (Matthew 28:18-20)
- Other verses (examples include: 2 Corinthians 3:17-18, 13:14; Ephesians 1:3, 13-14, 2:18; Acts 20:28)

### Why does this matter?

- We are greatly L\_\_\_\_\_ by God, demonstrated through the death of Jesus for us (Romans 5:8).
- Those who believe in Jesus are completely F\_\_\_\_\_ (1 John 1:9).
- We are invited into C\_\_\_\_\_ with the God of Community (Romans 5:9-11; 2 Corinthians 5:16-21).
- We are never A\_\_\_\_\_. God is always present with his people through the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:20; 1 Corinthians 6:19; John 14:15-16).
- Repentance is not loss, but G\_\_\_\_\_ (Acts 2:38-39).
